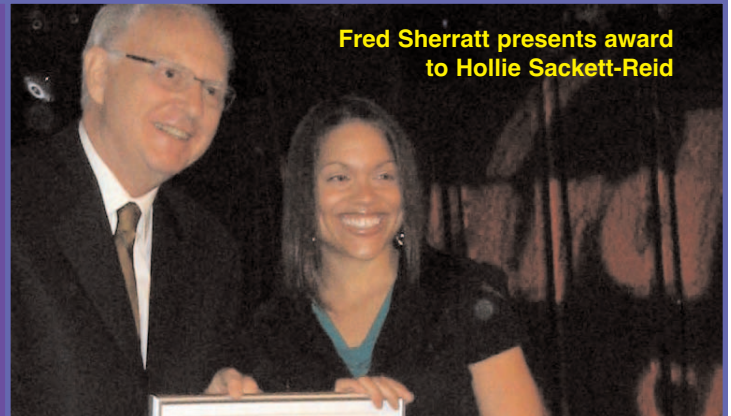
John Geddes in Cannes
