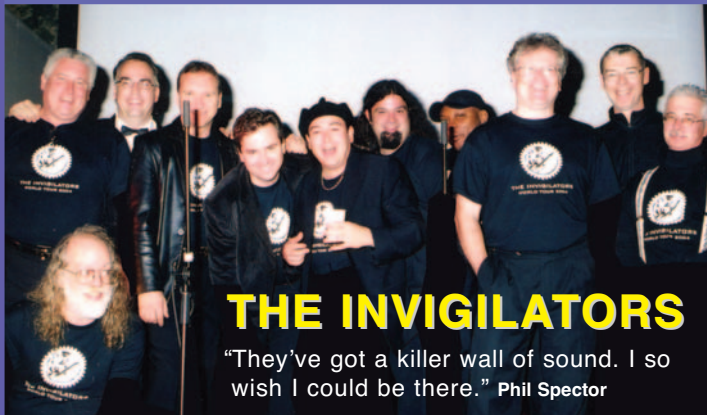
Brown to Paisley
